In the early 1900s, a young man applied for a job as a Morse code operator. Many applicants were seated, filling out forms, and waiting to be summoned into the inner office. After a few minutes, the young man stood up and walked straight into the inner office. The other applicants stared with complete disbelief. They were all convinced that young man just killed any chance he had of landing the job.

However, just a few minutes later, the boss and the young man walked out. The boss said to the other applicants, "Everyone, thank you very much for coming, but the job has just been filled." The other applicants started grumbling and one spoke up, "Wait just a minute. He was the last to come in, but he got the job. Why?"
