Sleeping Through the Storm

A young man applied for a job as a farmhand. When the farmer asked for his qualifica-

tions, he said, "I can sleep when the wind blows." This puzzled the farmer, but he liked the young man and hired him. A few days later, the farmer and his wife were awakened in the night by a violent storm. They quickly began to check around and see if all was secure. They found that the shutters of the farmhouse had been securely fastened. A good supply of logs had been set next to the fireplace.

Meanwhile, the young man slept soundly. The farmer and his wife then inspected their property. They found that the farm tools had been placed in the storage shed, safe from the elements. The tractor had been moved into the garage. The barn was properly locked. Even the animals were calm. All was well. The farmer then understood the meaning of the young man's words, 'I can sleep when the wind blows.' Because the farmhand did his work loyally and faithfully when the skies were clear, he was prepared for the storm when it broke. So when the wind blew, he was not afraid. He could sleep in peace.

The moral of this illustration is simple: be prepared. Anyone can put forth the effort when the emergency arrives, but by then it might be too late. We try to repair the house to prevent major issues. We save money for car breakdowns. Some people even save for possible emergency room visits. It's good to be prepared and it removes a lot of stress. This has never been truer when preparing for eternity.

Matthew 24:42-44 warns, "Therefore be on the alert, for you do not know which day your Lord is coming. But be sure of this, that if the head of the house had known at what time of the night the thief was coming, he would have been on the alert and would not have allowed his house to be broken into. For this reason you also must be ready; for the Son of Man is coming at an hour when you do not think He will."

If there is anything in life we want to be prepared for, it's Christ's coming. When He arrives, it will be too late to change our eternal destination. The question is, are we prepared to meet with the Lord (Matthew 6:21-23)? If not, then today, while the skies are clear, is the time to get ready.
