BLACK FRIDAY



On the day after Thanksgiving, millions will hit the stores for big sales as the Christmas season officially begins. The day has become known as "Black Friday." The popular explana-

tion became that this day represented the point in the year when retailers begin to turn a profit, thus going from being "in the red" to being "in the black."

In contrast, the day Jesus was crucified has become known as "Good Friday." The popu-

lar explanation being that this day represented the point in mankind's history when man left the black curse of sin and death to enjoying the salvation of Christ through the blood shed on the cross; thus, mankind went from being "in the black" world of sin, to being "in the red" of Christ's saving blood.



As the innocent blood of God's dying Son ran down the cross and dripped onto Golgotha's soil, the blackness of sin and death faded away into defeat. "But thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:57). Jesus said it best, "I have come as Light into the world, so that everyone who believes in Me will not remain in darkness" (John 12:46).



Let us gather around the Lord's table, not once a year, but every Lord's Day, and remember the
